

## EDITORIAL

This number of the *Goiano Bulletin of Geography* already presents the first results of changes in our editorial policies which treats about the publication of articles in English. In each edition, from this number, the Editorial Board will select articles for bilingual publication. This policy, which implies in enlarging of costs, was only possible with the support of the Department of Journals of the Publishing House of UFG and of the Support Program for Journals Publication of the UFG. The first two articles, in bilingual edition, by the authors Carlos Eduardo Santos Maia and Ernandy Luiz Vasconcelos Lima, aboard relevant themes for Brazilian geography. The first challenges the readers to think in a new research agenda for geography, focusing the garment geography. The second, quite relevant for the current scenario, analyzes the role of planning in the logic of the big events. The diversity of thematics, thus as the institutional origin of the authors who contributed with this number, demonstrates the consolidation on the *Goiano Bulletin of Geography*.

I would like to thank the authors who trusted the *Goiano Bulletin of Geography* the result of its intellectual efforts and, specially, the counselors who sent, with seriousness and punctuality, the evaluations for this edition. Even though the scenario announced for the next years does not be the best, considering the economy, we will keep the effort to keep the quality of the editorial work. One of the biggest challenges for the Brazilian journals refers to the process of professionalization, which demands disposition of financial resources for the process of reviewing, translating, normalisation and typesetting, beyond the work of the secretariat. In relation to this last work, I would like to register acknowledgement to the geographers Juheina Lacerda Ribeiro Viana and Bruno Carneiro de Oliveira, who are responsible for the administrative process of the *Goiano Bulletin of Geography*. The prestige of the *Goiano Bulletin of Geography* is result of this volunteer work and deserves recognition of authors, readers and editors.
